The greatest gift that Allah Ta'ala blesses any person with is undoubtedly the gift of Imaan. Any person blessed with Imaan, has take care to and look after his Imaan very carefully very, until eventually he is blessed with death on Im-This indeed is the greatest success. aan. Allah Ta'ala the says in Qur-aan-e-Kareem;

وَلَا تَمُوتُنَّ إِلَّا وَأَنتُم مُّسْلِمُونَ

None of you should die except that you are Muslims (Believers)

This was the concern of all the Ambiyaa عَلَيْهِمِٱلسَّلَامُ . On their death beds, they would call their children and advise them to worship Allah سُبْحَانَهُوَتَعَالَى only and ensure that they die on Imaan and Islam.

Our passport for entry into Jannah is Imaan. Without this, no one will be allowed to enter. Abu Taalib, who was the beloved uncle of Rasulullah صَرَّالَنَّهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَمَرًا responsible for bringing him up and supporting him in the effort of inviting people to Islam, died without Imaan. Nabi صَرَّالَنَّهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَمَرًا was informed through wahi that he will enter the fire of Jahannam forever and ever. On the contrary, if a person was a disbeliever his entire life and he accepted Islam just before he passed away, he will be regarded as successful and will enter Jannah forever. From the eight subjects taught at a maktab, **Aqaaid** is the most important subject. This forms the foundation of Islam. The first thing a child is taught at the maktab is the five kalimahs, thereby strengthening his Imaan.

Children attending state and private schools are faced with huge challenges. Their Imaan is attacked from all sides. At times they are made to pray to Christ and ask him for their daily bread. After meals they are made to say grace and thank Jesus for providing them with food. This affects the Imaan of these young children. Darwin's theory of evolution is compulsorily taught in all schools leaving a child with doubts as to who his creator is.

It is for this reason that a child, from a young impressionable age, is taught the important beliefs of a Muslim to combat the attacks against our Imaan and Islam. The syllabus has been prepared to help firmly embed the fundamental beliefs of a Muslim in the heart and mind of every Muslim child.

May Allah Ta'ala accept this humble effort and make it a means of safeguarding our Imaan.

- 6. I believe in taqdeer (that good and bad is from Allah Ta'ala).
- 7. I believe in life after death.

Lesson 3

Al-Haadi (The One Who Guides)

- 1. Allah Ta'ala is the One who guides us to the straight path.
- 2. Allah Ta'ala guides us to that which is beneficial for us.
- 3. Allah Ta'ala grants Hidaayah (guidance) to whomsoever He wills.
- 4. No one else can grant Hidaayah to any person.

Allah Ta'ala Guides Hazrat Salmaan Al-Faarisi Radhiyallahu Anhu

Hazrat Salmaan Al-Faarisi Radhiyallaahu anhu was from a place called "Jay" in Persia. His father loved him very much and put him in charge of looking after the fire which they worshipped.

Allah Ta'ala inspired him to leave his home in search of the truth. He lived with a few pious people when eventually a Christian priest told him to go to Madinah Munawwarah to find the truth.

This was the same time for the coming of the final Nabi. So, he came to Madinah Munawwarah where he met Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam and accepted Islam.




AL-ALEEM -The All-Knowing

- To laugh or mock at the Sunnah of Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam.
- To say any other religion is correct. E.g. Christianity or Judaism
- To say the Quraan Kareem is incomplete.
- To doubt any aspect of Islam.

SHIRK (TO ASSOCIATE PARTNERS WITH ALLAH TA'ALA)

- 1. A person who commits Shirk is called a mushrik.
- 2. Hindus and fire worshippers are mushriks.
- 3. To take another being or person as a partner with Allah Ta'ala is shirk.

SIN

 - a) Listening to music.
 - b) Watching TV and videos.
 - c) Boys keeping the trouser below the ankles.
 - d) Cutting the hair in different lengths.
 - e) Drinking wine or eating pork.
 - f) Eating Haraam food e.g. Haraam chicken or Haraam meat i.e. it was slaughtered by a non-muslim.
- 6. If we commit a sin we should immediately ask Allah Ta'ala for forgiveness.



How to make Taubah?

- 1. We should feel regret for breaking the command of Allah Ta'ala.

- 3. We should make intention not to commit the sin again.

Allah Ta'ala says in a Hadith Qudsi O son of Aadam, if your sins were to reach the sky (i.e they are so much that they fill the space between the earth and the sky) then you seek forgiveness from me, I will forgive you and it will not matter to me.

Hazrat Sa'd Radhiyallahu Anhu's wife went to Nabi Sallalahu Alaihi Wasallam and informed him that the two brothers of Saad Radhiyallahu Anhu had taken all the wealth in accordance to the pre-Islamic custom.

His son Yahya was sleeping close to the horse. Hazrat Usaid Radiyallahu Anhu became afraid that the horse may trample upon his son. Hazrat Usaid Radhiyallahu Anhu went towards Hazrat Yahya Radhiyallahu Anhu to pick him up.

After carrying him, he looked up in the sky. Then at that time, he saw something in the sky which looked like a cloud with lights in it. The cloud began floating into the sky until he could not see it any longer.

The next morning, he informed Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam about this. Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam said, "Those were angels that were listening to you. If you had kept on reciting, they would have remained there until the morning and all the people would have seen them."

Hazrat Umar Radhiyallahu Anhu thereafter looked in the Torah and began to read from it. Nabi Sallalahu Alayhi Wasallam became very angry on account of Hazrat Umar Radhiyallahu Anhu reading from the Torah whereas our book is not the Torah but the Quraan Kareem.

Nabi Sallalahu Alayhi Wasallam then said to Hazrat Umar Radhiyallahu Anhu: "Are you in doubt O son of Khattab (regarding your Deen).

- Following the Sunnah of Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam is a sign of having true love for him.
- Those who love Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam will be with him in the highest stages in Jannah.

Lesson 22

JAHANNAM

- 1. The fire of Jahannam is seventy times hotter than the fire of this world.
- 2. A person will be forced to drink boiling water, blood and pus.
- 3. The food of Jahannam will be thorny trees.
- 4. Jahannam is a place of misery and pain.

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Lesson 23

- Meat-eating animals such as lions, tigers etc have sharp teeth and claws so that they can quickly catch their prey.

- Plant-eating animals such as cows, sheep etc have flat teeth to grind leaves and grass.

Allah Ta'ala made everything in the best way for their intended purpose and survival.





- 1. Nabi Sallallahu Alayhi Wasallam encouraged us to have Haya (Shame and Modesty).
- 2. There should be Haya in everything we do. Eg. Dressing, talking etc.
- 3. Haya will save a person from acting shamelessly.
- 4. Haya will beautify all our actions.
- 5. A person who does not have Haya is likely to carry out shameless and wrong actions.Haya is an important part of Imaan.
- 6. It will save us from disobeying Allah Ta'ala and Nabi Sallalahu Alayhi Wasallam.

Just as clothes protect our bodies, Haya protects our Imaan.

The Queen of Jannah

During her final illness, Hazrat Faatimah Radhi Allahu Anha said to Hazrat Asmaa bint Umais Radhi Allahu Anha, "I dislike what happens to women after they pass away. They are covered in a cloth which allows the shape of their bodies to be seen and described."

Hazrat Asmaa bint Umais Radhi Allahu Anha said to her, "Would you like to know what I saw in the land of Abysinnia?" She then asked for some palm leaves to be brought. She then shaped the leaves into a frame which she placed over the bier, and then draped the cloth over the frame. In this way, the body of a deceased woman would be entirely concealed.

Hazrat Faatimah Radhi Allahu Anha said, "This is excellent!" She also made a bequest that she be buried at night and her wish was fulfilled.

Hazrat Faatimah Radhi Allahu Anha was the first woman in Islam whose body was covered in this manner at the time of her burial so that her body could not be seen by strange men.
