In our eagerness to capture the moment, it should not be that we sacrifice it by committing sin.

Photography of animate objects is Haraam and sinful. Nabi sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam said: "The worst of punishment on the day of Qiyaamah will be meted out to those who engage in picture-making."

Imagine a visitor taking out their phone, ignoring you and beginning to take selfies of themselves in your lounge!

We are in the presence of Sayyidina Rasulullaah sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam who is alive in his blessed Qabr and who replies to our greetings. For Allah's sake, show the required respect while in the esteemed presence of Nabi sallallaahu 'alayhi wa sallam.

Ibn Umar Radhiyallaahu anhu would set up two tents for himself, one inside the boundaries of the Haram and one outside. For his Salaah and Ibaadah, he would use the tent inside the Haram, and for his mundane activities, he would use the tent outside the Haram so that he might avoid disrespecting the Haram area.

In addition, actions are only accepted by Allah Ta'ala if done solely for His pleasure. In the zeal of capturing the moment and posting it on social media, we risk sacrificing our sincerity and losing the reward we may have otherwise attained.
