☛ Try it this month

- Speak slowly and clearly.
- Repeat core concepts three times.
- Get individual learners to repeat the concept.
- Pause after each important concept and ask a student to repeat it in their own words.
- By applying the Sunnah methodology, learners will in-sha Allah easily grasp the desired content.

Teaching in the Light of Sunnah

- Rasulullah ﷺ was sent as a teacher to mankind.
- The Noor (divine light) that is attached to Sunnah will be achieved by applying Sunnah methodology.
- By adopting Sunnah teaching methods, our lessons will not only benefit the learners but will increase our reward.
